Whanau Development

Social Worker in School

Hauraki Maori Trust Board is involved with Social Workers in Schools. Our social worker works with primary aged children from four schools in the Paeroa District - Karangahake, Tirohia, Paeroa Central, Miller Avenue.

Our social worker works with the school staff to help prevent bullying and aggressive behavior, and provides helpful programs for children to help bridge the gap between school and home.

The main focus is on working with these children and their whanau with any problems they may have, ensuring they get the best opportunities to achieve a better education. He helps them to understand who they are, where they come from and to assist them in carving a future for themselves by offering them choices

Tiakitia Hauraki Mokopuna

This service sees the Hauraki Maori Trust Board by order of the Family Court receive into its care, Mokopuna of Hauraki, who would otherwise have remained in the custody of Child, Youth and Family Services.

It is our aim to return these mokopuna back to whanau. One of the ways we do this is by strengthening whanau potential.

Rangatahi Services

The Hauraki Maori Trust Board rangatahi service supports rangatahi to make informed life choices that will increase their level of participation and success in education, sport, cultural identity, health and social interactions.

The service will bring rangatahi together with the view to strengthening rangatahi networks and encourage peer mentoring.

To be involved, rangatahi must express a desire to move out of dysfunctional interactions or express a desire to mentor other rangatahi who are at risk.

Whanau Support Services

Our Whanau Support Service contributes to the well-being, empowerment and development of Hauraki Whanau and their tamariki. We promote and support Te Ao Maori practices to help heal whanau violence.

We offer support and advocacy:

- Inform whanau of their rights and entitlements
- Provide and assist whanau with access to professional assistance
- Assist whanau to access whanau violence mediators or facilitators

Hauraki Family Start

Hauraki Family Start is an early intervention, preventative, home based service for whanau facing challenges in the areas of health, welfare or education.

We aim to improve and add to the strengths that already exist within the whanau by providing support and encouraging positive parenting.

The service is child-centered, family focused and strength based.

Family Start is available to:

- Pregnant mums
- Whanau with babies under 12 months old
- Whanau who live in the Hauraki Rohe



Tikanga Program

This program draws on Hauraki Iwi philosophy values and embodies knowledge, practices, laws and traditions unique to Hauraki whaanui.

The programs focus is on supporting Hauraki adults who are rehabilitating from offending to re-engage with Hauraki tikanga and kawa in a marae setting.
